Musical Building Blocks Learning to perform and compose using the Musical Elements (builds on knowledge of Y1-Y4 in all units at St Nicholas) Sea Shanties Creating Group performances and developing singing skills (builds on knowledge of Reception Unit 6 and then Y4 Unit 2 and Y4 Unit 3 when children study ‘Folk’ music)	Musical Patterns Performing West African Drumming and Indonesian Gamelan (builds on knowledge of Y2 Unit 3 at St Nicholas)	Solo Keyboard Performance Keyboard & notation skills, performing to the class (builds on knowledge of Y3 and Y4 where children study this type of notation at St Nicholas [children study more of graphic notation in KS1])
